Who can go?

Cost: \$424 plus the cost of transportation

- \$50 deposit due March 1 (this is non-refundable)
 - Don't allow finances to keep you from going. We will do multiple fundraisers, and if you participate in all of them, we typically can get total cost for the student under \$100.
- May 26 Final Payment Due (amount TBD based on money raised and participation in fundraising)

June 2 Parents complete all forms (you can do that electronically, or we will provide an opportunity at church).

June 16 ALL teens attend 9:00 a.m. CBC service AND 12:30 p.m. Maranatha service so we can pray for the trip

How Fundraisers work

We take the total amount raised at fundraisers – divide it among the students who worked the fundraiser and subtract from their total cost. You can also help your student do some odd jobs/raise some of their own money and put it towards camp.
