Sermon Discussion Guide

Sermon Title: *Witnesses* **Text:** Acts 10:34–43

- 1. Why do you think it was so radical for Peter to say, "God does not show favoritism"?
 - How might this have challenged everything he believed up until that point?
- 2. How has the resurrection of Jesus changed your view of life today—not just eternity?
 - Has it shifted your sense of purpose, identity, or how you see others?
- 3. What "truths" or assumptions from your upbringing or culture has Jesus challenged in your life?
 - Are there still categories or boundaries you hold that God might be calling you to reconsider?
- 4. Peter didn't expect God to work through Cornelius. Who in your life might represent a "Cornelius"—someone you wouldn't expect to be spiritually open?
 - What would it look like to show up in their life with love and grace?
- 5. What does it mean for *you* to be a "witness" to the resurrection today?
 - Is it more about words, actions, or presence? How might God be nudging you to share the hope you've received?

Where in your life or community have you drawn boundaries God might be asking you to erase?

What would it mean to believe that God is at work even there—even in "unexpected" people or places?
