Can you think of a time when worship felt especially meaningful or especially distracted? What made the difference?

Scripture Reflection

1. Guarding Our Steps in Worship

"Guard your steps when you go to the house of God... Go near to listen..." (v.1)

- What does it mean to "guard your steps" as we enter worship today?
- How do you prepare (or not prepare) to hear from God during worship?
- The sermon said, "God's not looking for content creators or influencers in worship." What do you think that means for how we approach worship, prayer, or singing?

2. Listening More than Speaking

"Let your words be few... God is in heaven and you are on earth." (v.2)

- Why is listening hard in today's world?
- How might listening more (to others and to God) actually deepen your worship life?

Vows and Follow-Through

"It is better not to make a vow than to make one and not fulfill it."

- Have you ever made a commitment to God that you later found hard to keep?
- The sermon said we need space to "renew some vows we made to God."
 - Is there a promise or desire you once expressed to God that you'd like to revisit or recommit to now?

Wealth and Worship

"Whoever loves money never has enough... This too is meaningless."

• What's the difference between enjoying God's gifts and worshipping the gifts?

God in the Equation

"When God gives someone wealth... and the ability to enjoy them... this is a gift of God."

- What changes when **God** enters the picture in our work, money, and meaning?
- How do you respond to this line from the sermon: "God uses the pain, toil, and chasing-the-wind meaninglessness of this world to remind us we are not made for this world."

***** Application Challenge

- Practice coming to worship prepared to listen. Try spending a few minutes in silence before the service.
- Reflect on one vow or commitment you've made to God and ask Him if it's time to renew it.
- Ask God for the rare gift of contentment with what He has already given.
