

Sermon Discussion Guide – Jesus is Coming -Revelation 22:7-21

What's a song (hymn, worship song, or even secular song) that has carried you through a difficult time? Why that song?

Dan mentioned that Revelation was written to Christians living under persecution, not as an “end-times code.” How does that perspective change the way you hear this passage?

Four times John repeats: “I am coming soon.” Why would this be so important for weary, persecuted believers?

What does trusting God's promise of renewal look like for us while we wait?

Dan said, “If our vision of God's Kingdom is too closely tied to our own socioeconomic and cultural realities, our vision will be too small.”

- What are some ways our culture narrows our vision of God's kingdom?
- How can we cultivate a bigger vision of what God is doing in His creation?

Revelation ends not with fear or wrath, but with grace (v. 21). How does that shape your understanding of God's character?

The sermon emphasized: “The gospel is good news especially to those who don't yet believe it.”

- How can we extend grace to those who are far from God?
- Where do you feel challenged to live out this kind of grace in your relationships?

Which part of John's closing vision gives you the most comfort or encouragement today?

How might you sing (or live out) the “song of grace” this week in a way that others can hear it?
